CHAPTER 5

OPEN LEGATO RUDIMENTS

The first group of Legato Rudiments that we will explore together are the Open Legato Rudiments.

The Open Legato Rudiments are combinations of legato motions which involve a single open string. This means that there will be at least one note that is open in the Rudiment, giving your Fretting hand a chance to rest.

The specific Open Legato Rudiments which have been included here are by far the most common that you will encounter in real music.

There are certainly many other possible ways of playing on a single string, so feel free to look for others once you have these ones learned.
